The cut off date for comments is now 7th December. The application is currently expected to be considered during January 2019 and the decision should be known later that month.

Pub News

The <u>Gordon Arms</u> in Chislehurst was sympathetically refurbished in autumn 2018 and is much improved as a result. All the seating and flooring has been replaced, but the pub has retained its traditional feel. The pub also now offers a much-improved cask ale range with six handpumps. In addition to the two regular beers, visitors are now likely to find one or more beers from small local breweries. A full menu now is available at midweek lunchtimes, with Pie & Mash served as a speciality on Saturdays. Events at the pub include a quiz every other Wednesday, and also occasional "ladies' nights". Dogs are not allowed in the pub.

Another pub that has recently reopened following a substantial refurbishment is the Pawleyne Arms in the centre of Penge. It is now operated as a Craft Union Pub Co outlet, part of the EI (Enterprise) group. The good news is that after many years cask ale has been reintroduced with two handpumps initially dispensing Fuller's London Pride and Sharp's Doom Bar.
