# **The Chelsfield Planning Appeal**

Bromley CAMRA has submitted a written statement to the Planning Inspectorate opposing this appeal. The pubs owners, Punch Taverns, applied to Bromley Council for planning permission to demolish the pub and build a block of flats, incorporating a smaller pub and a shop on the ground floor. The Council has indicated that it would have refused the application for a number of reasons, including the loss of a highly valued public house and heritage asset and because the replacement building would be out of character with the locality.

Bromley CAMRA supports these reasons for refusal. The loss of the pub even for a temporary period, which could stretch to months and years, is unnecessary and unacceptable. The Chelsfield is a popular community asset, with over a thousand objections to the planning application from local residents and pub users. It is an attractive neo-Georgian pub and good example of Inter-War pub design. Bromley CAMRA has also nominated the pub as an Asset of Community Value (ACV); we are still waiting for Bromley Council to make a decision on this. The appeal decision should be made later this summer.

And lastly but by no means least:
