6th Beckenham Beer & Cider Festival Wash Up Event

Date: Saturday 21st September 2019

Venue: Star & Garter, Bromley

An invitation was sent to all of those CAMRA Members who kindly volunteered at our successful Beer Festival in late July. The 'wash-up' as it is referred to, is an opportunity to meet up again with friends made at the Festival, exchange ideas on what went well and where we can improve and to hear for some of the people behind the scenes with their feedback. It was great fun and was attended by 34 members who enjoyed a few complimentary beers and some food whilst listening to the updates. I would like to thank Paul Graydon who is stepping down after two years of running very successful Festivals. Paul opened proceedings with a summary of the event and also customer feedback from those kind enough to complete the forms. The feeling was that although the attendance was down slightly on last year, there was a lot of praise, especially for the cooling team who did an exceptional job of keeping the cask beer and cider in great condition as we basked in record temperatures. Another success was the introduction of the Keg bar which offered a thoughtful selection of cold beers that were very welcome, particularly on the opening day where temperatures soared to 90F. Finally, we offered contactless payment alongside cash for the first time and this proved to be very popular.

It was great to meet up with the volunteers who attended and I would like to thank them again for stepping up to help as it is simply not

possible to run a Festival without a breadth of help and support from our growing Bromley branch membership.

More people joined Bromley CAMRA at the Festival than ever before and we are so lucky to have so many wonderful pubs, tap rooms, breweries and bottle shops within the Borough to visit and support. There really is something for everyone.

I would encourage members to become more active, either by interacting with our improved social media channels or coming along on some of the diverse socials that appear above and in the branch diary.

On 3rd October some members of the branch visited the Five Points brewery tap, the Pembury Tavern in Hackney, where John Horn presented the certificate on behalf of the branch to Max Descloux, one of their brewers. Also at that evening we visited the nearby brewery, where we had a preview tasting of the new Five Points Green Hop beer, which is being launched on 10th October.

Presentation to Double Vision Cider Co.

Visitors to the 6th Beckenham Beer & Cider Festival held in July, voted Double Vision Cider's Impeared Vision Perry as the perry of the festival.

On Saturday 5th October, a small group of Bromley CAMRA members made their way down to Marlpit Farm, Boughton Monchelsea (near Maidstone, Kent), transported in style in a vintage Bentley driven by Chris Crowther, a long standing member of Bromley branch. Barry Phillips, Social Secretary for Bromley branch, made the presentation of the award to Simon Boarer, the owner and proprietor of Double Vision. Also in attendance were Mike Allen and Lorraine Davies who ran the cider and perry bar at the Beckenham festival.

Royal Bell Hotel, Bromley

Most members will be aware that this Grade II Listed former hotel has been disused and boarded up for a number of years; it appears that several members of the branch have memories of going there in the days when it was a Berni Inn in the 1980s. There was a rare opportunity to see inside the hotel when it was opened to the public as part of the London Open House weekend last month. On the ground floor, the Bell Tap, a new 'craft bar' is due to open early in 2020 and it is hoped to reopen the ballroom on the first floor as a music yenue.
