- There will be a celebratory evening at the club, on Monday
 9th from 6:30pm. All members of CAMRA are welcome.
- **Tuesday 10th** (6.30pm) Young Members Social at the <u>Real Ale Way</u>, 55 Station Approach, Hayes BR2 7EB.
 - All CAMRA members aged below 40 are welcome to attend this Young Members social.
 - The pub are setting aside a special area for attendees.
 - This family-owned micropub opened in July 2018, and offers a most welcome new choice for local drinkers and rail commuters alike.
 The pub overlooks the entrance to Hayes station, and is served by numerous bus routes. Up to 9 real ales are served on gravity from a cold room to the rear of the bar. Currently a joint runner-up in the Bromley CAMRA Pub of the Year competition.

- **Wednesday 11th** Meet the brewer (Sambrook's) at The <u>Harvest Moon</u>, 141-143 High Street, Orpington BR6 0LQ.
 - In December, the Harvest Moon in Orpington celebrates the 25th anniversary of its opening.
 - As part of the festivities, all CAMRA members are invited to the pub on Wednesday December 11th between 6 and 8pm when there will an opportunity to meet the brewers from Sambrook's, and we hope that many of you will attend.
 - This event does not appear in our diary entries in London Drinker or What's Brewing, because we hadn't received the invitation at the time these publications went to press.
- **Saturday 28th** Post Xmas Social in Bromley North starting at the Freelands Tayern.
 - What better way to get the excesses of Xmas out of the system than by joining our annual brisk walk between some of the best pubs in Bromley North!
 - Our social starts at noon at The <u>Freelands Tavern</u>, 31 Freelands Road BR1 3H.
 - We aim to arrive at our second pub, The <u>Red Lion</u>, 10 North Rd. BR1 3LG by 12.45pm. This pub is a short walk from the Freelands Tavern. The pub was Bromley CAMRA's pub of the year in 2012 (and is currently a joint runner-up) and is also the only pub to have been featured in every edition of the Good Beer Guide since Bromley CAMRA reformed in 2011.
 - Our next stop (from 1.40pm) is The <u>Anglesey Arms</u>, 90 Palace Rd. BR1 3JX; This pub, which is a well-maintained Shepherd Neame outlet, is a short walk from The Red Lion.
 - Our next port of call at 2.30pm is The <u>Railway Tavern</u>, 45 East St., BR1 1QQ. This pub is a short walk from The Anglesey Arms and is directly opposite Bromley North Station.
 - By 3.15pm we will have walked the short distance to The <u>Partridge</u>, 194 High St. BR1 1HE. This excellent Fuller's pub is close to the Market Square in the centre of Bromley, which is a few minutes' walk from either Bromley North or Bromley South stations. Several bus routes pass close to the pub.
 - A further short walk will lead us to arrive at 4pm at our final pub for the afternoon - The <u>Star & Garter</u>, 227 High St BR1 1NZ. This superb pub which reopened in November 2016 having been closed for more than two years – is close to the Market Square in the centre of Bromley. It is currently the Bromley CAMRA Pub of the Year, and at the time of writing (end of November) all cask ales are

priced at £3.00/pint. The ales themselves are never mainstream, and there could be up to seven of them. Usually at least one is a porter or stout. For those that want it there is also an impressive range of draught keg beers.

January 2020

- **Wednesday 8th** Bromley Social, starting at 8pm at The <u>Lock & Barrel</u>, 18 London Rd, Bromley BR1 3QR.
 - The pub is Bromley's newest micropub. The pub opened its doors for the first time on Friday 3rd May 2019. The name is derived from the ironmongers who previously occupied the premises.
 - Several real ales, usually from breweries in Kent are dispensed from a cold room behind the bar. The pub is located north of the Market Square, close to the (sadly now closed) Hop & Rye pub.
 - A short walk towards Bromley Market Square will lead us to arrive at The <u>Star & Garter</u>, 227 High St BR1 1NZ for 9.15pm.
 - Another opportunity for you who may have missed our post Xmas social visit to the Bromley CAMRA current Pub of the Year
