Welcome Back to CAMRA Beer Festivals

CAMRA's beer festivals are back and gearing up for a return, after an almost two-year hiatus due to the coronavirus pandemic.

In March 2020, when the first lockdown started, all CAMRA official events were suspended for the safety of members and beer festival lovers, and in line with government regulations.

Now as we begin to return to more normal circumstances and restrictions are lifted, branch beer festivals that have been 18 months in the making are able to open their doors once more. Many of us will have missed the social benefits of a drink with friends and look forward to meeting up with loved ones and fellow branch members over a pint.

Planning has now started for Bromley CAMRA's next **Beckenham Beer and Cider Festival**. The dates to pencil into your diary are **Thursday 28**th **July to Saturday 30**th **July 2022**. More details will be available early next year.

And, after missing out on CAMRA's flagship event for two years, members can now also look forward to the return of the **Great British Beer Festival** in August 2022.

Things may look a little different at your favourite festivals - national CAMRA and local branches are introducing a rigorous safety scheme to make sure our local festivals are Covid secure. It is paramount to ensure all beer festival attendees are happy and feel safe and comfortable when visiting beer festivals, and processes have been put in place to ensure this.

The updates to CAMRA festival health and safety documents include that a coronavirus risk assessment be completed during the festival planning stages, as well as ensuring all festival volunteers receive additional induction, information, instruction training and supervision in light of the pandemic. Other safety procedures include:

- Specific cleaning / sanitisation plans and glass guidelines
- Contactless payments where ever possible
- Tickets sold in advance of all sessions
- Use of Track & Trace
- Specific guidance for volunteers and third party vendors
- Social distancing where possible

We shall then proceed to visit the remaining micropubs as detailed on the map.

It is likely that we will be joined by some members of the local Thanet CAMRA branch on the day; I'm sure they will make us feel most welcome.




The Guide is due to be released on 12th November 2021.

We are rolling into the Autumn as I write this up – time for dark beers and log fires to be lit in your favourite hostelry. Also time for the bringing in of hop bines and apples, crisp mornings, dew covered cobwebs and failing car batteries. Well, let's hope not the latter anyway!

So, with pubs returning to a near sense of normality, what has been happening of late?

Champion Beer of Great Britain

As featured last month, voting for the next Champion Beer of Britain has now started.

Yes, you, as a member of CAMRA, have until 1st November to vote for your favourite beer in the UK's most prestigious beer competition. Previous winners have included Surrey Hills 'Shere Drop' and Siren Craft Brew for 'Broken Dream Breakfast Stout'. So, what are you going to vote for?

As a reminder, this year there are now twelve different categories including:

- Milds: up to and including 4% ABV
- Session Bitters: up to and including 4.3% ABV
- Premium Bitters: 4.4% 6.4% ABV
- Session Pale, Blond and Golden Ales: up to and including 4.3% ABV
- Premium Pale, Blond and Golden Ales: 4.4% 6.4% ABV
- British & New World IPAs: 5.5% and above
- Brown and Red Ales, Old Ales and Strong Milds: Up to 6.4%
- Session Stouts and Porters: up to and including 4.9% ABV
- Strong Stouts and Porters including Imperial Stouts and Baltic Porters: 5.0% ABV and above
- Barley Wines and Strong Ales: 6.5% and above
- Speciality Beers Differently produced
- Speciality Beers Flavoured

You can read more about these categories in the Beer Style guide leaflet <u>available on line</u>. As National Director, Gary Timmins put it "CAMRA members will be able to vote using our special voting portal, and in a range of different categories, from Milds to Bitters, IPAs to Barley Wines, and more! We need our membership to let us know which beers are the cream of the crop, so don't forget to vote and help ensure your favourite pint is in with a chance to win".






These continue apace with CAMRA awarding 18 breweries and cider makers with Golden Awards to mark half a century of our organisation's campaigns. Winners have been chosen for their successes in standing the test of time; being breweries or cider and perry producers that have gone above and beyond in delivering excellence or innovation over the years. So, who were they?

The 18 Golden Awards recipients are: Adnams; Batemans; Brains; Coach House; Durham; Fuller's; Harvey's; Hop Back; Moor; Oliver's Cider & Perry; Orkney; Robinsons; Shepherd Neame; Thwaites; Timothy Taylor; West Berkshire; West Croft Cider; and Wye Valley.

Local presentation events are in the process of being arranged, with each brewery or cider maker receiving a certificate of achievement.

The Golden Awards are celebrating recipients in three different categories: 'Pubs', 'Pints', and 'People'. The winners in the 'People' category will be announced later in the year.

Cider report

And not forgetting Cider, CAMRA has called upon the Chancellor and MPs to support UK cider makers with all 70 MPs that have makers in their constituencies being sent a copy of 'Modern British Cider', helping to highlight the key issues facing small and independent cider makers.

Solutions being suggested include:

- A progressive duty system for small cider producers as the present duty exemption has effectively acted as a glass ceiling for aspiring cider makers,
- A call to raise the minimum juice content did you know that the current minimum juice content required to sell as cider is just 35% yes, some so called ciders you may buy have only 35% apple juice heaven alone knows what else? Water, sugar, chemicals, the traditional scrumpy dead rat (just kidding)? I shudder to think. A modest increase to 50% being proposed (methinks that is still pretty low what do you think?)
- Ingredient listing is not a legal requirement for alcoholic drinks. This should be changed so that we are better informed.


Now I thought in my innocence that cider was made up from pressed apples only. How wrong I could be!
