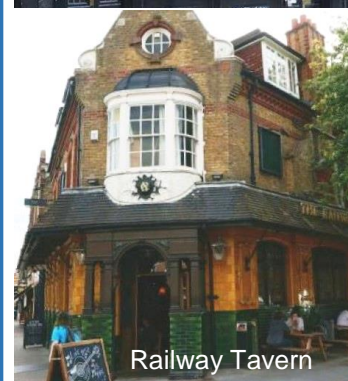

In the February e-Newsletter, I mentioned that we needed volunteers to serve on the 2022-23 Committee in several key areas. I'm pleased to say that most of these roles do now have candidates, which will ensure continuity, and give our branch an experienced team going forward. However, we still need volunteers for the following posts, which are shown below, together with a short description and clickable links to further role information:

Pub Protection Officer ([Role summary](#) and [Role guidance](#))

- Would you like to protect pubs in your area and campaign to keep them from change or closure? The purpose of the role is to protect pubs and significant pub heritage within the branch area and lead campaigns to save or protect threatened pubs.

Public Affairs Contact ([Role summary](#) and [Role guidance](#))

- The purpose of the role is to engage with, lobby and persuade local Councillors, MPs and other political representatives within our branch boundaries to support CAMRA's local and national campaigns.

Vice Chair ([Role summary](#)) and [Role guidance](#))

- The role of the Vice Chair is to support the Branch Chair, sharing tasks where possible, and deputise in their absence. You would also deputise for, or accompany the Chair, at regional meetings.

Young Members Contact ([Role summary](#) and [Role guidance](#))

- This is an important role that helps the branch to evolve and develop its future. The main focus is to recruit young members and encourage their participation in CAMRA activities, arrange social activities for them, and to promote real ale and cider.

All of the above roles can be fitted around the time you have to spare. You would not be *'thrown into the deep end'*, since guidance, training and shadowing will be available to help you into the position. This is a unique opportunity for you as a CAMRA branch member to bring your ideas along, have your say, and really help shape our future.

Beer Festival Update

Preparations continue for the return of Bromley Branch's beer & cider festival. Festival Coordinator Charles Tucker reports on the latest news.



With the government announcing an end to all remaining Covid restrictions in England we can look forward to a traditional CAMRA beer and cider festival at Beckenham Rugby Club from 28th - 30th July. Everything is now falling into place nicely, with the planning and the festival business plan having now been agreed with CAMRA. The beer and cider selection teams are currently finalising the likely order list and suitable caterers are being scoped.

The festival planning team have been working on a suitable logo and the theme for this year will be a general one, with the emphasis on [LocAle](#) and sustainability ([Drink Greener](#)) and the fact that the venue is at a rugby club. The logo will soon be published on our web site and social media channels, but meanwhile here is an early draft so you can see the basic idea.

For the first time in our beer festivals, we are looking for **cask sponsors** to assist our overall budget. So how will this work?

- The sponsors name will be listed in the programme notes and their name/logo will feature on the cask front at the Festival
- We will also advertise their cask sponsorship on our web site and social media
- Individual sponsorship of casks will also be available if someone wants to mark a significant event, such as birthdays, anniversaries, etc.
- Each cask sponsor will also have free admission for two people to the Festival on any day.
- The cask sponsorship price will be £50 for one cask or £90 for two casks.

This will run in tandem with the more usual sponsor's adverts in the festival programme. So, if anyone out there thinks they may know of a cask sponsor please get in touch, or why not treat your partner (or yourself) to a memorable cask display!

Another new approach at this festival will be the **online sale of festival entry tickets and beer tokens** using the CAMRA ticketing system called 'Tckty'. This will enable us to have a greater understanding of the numbers attending at each session and help the overall management of the event. We plan to start selling tickets from the end of March/beginning of April. Ticket prices will be £3 online and £4 at the door. CAMRA members and under-26 will be free. Beer tokens will be priced at £10.

The number of people completing the volunteer form is still increasing and, at the latest count, we have 30 volunteers, but we still need a few more. Sign up [here!](#)

We are still lacking people who have the 'Emergency First Aid at Work' qualification and we need a minimum of four such qualified people. We have an approved budget to train people and the course last about 6 hours, the qualification itself being valid for three years. To ensure the success of the festival please consider becoming one of our First Aiders - **no first aiders means no festival!**

Now that the festival budget has been approved by CAMRA, we can start to purchase items for the festival and advertising can go ahead. Entries for What's Brewing and the CAMRA website will be submitted shortly.

The next major steps will be preparing the Health & Safety Plan, festival insurance, and ordering the required items from the CAMRA warehouse.

There are now more than 90 pubs, micropubs, clubs, bars and taprooms in Bromley offering cask conditioned ale. Bromley CAMRA is proud to be able to recognise and reward quality pubs and clubs through the Good Beer Guide, and the Pub & Club of the Year awards.

Good Beer Guide

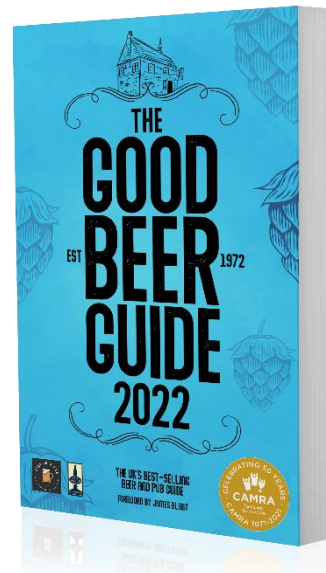
CAMRA's flagship publication is now in its 49th edition. The 2022 edition lists more than 4,500 of the UK's best pubs and clubs.

Unfortunately Bromley's allocation for the GBG is just 10 entries, whereas we have many more than 10 pubs/clubs in the Bromley area which deserve to be listed in the guide. This means that each year some difficult decisions have to be made.

Bromley CAMRA uses [Beer Scoring](#) as the sole means of identifying pubs/clubs for possible inclusion in the GBG. All the Beer Scores submitted during the year are collated, and then all branch members are invited to attend the GBG Selection Meeting in January each year, where the 'final 10' (plus 2 or 3 'reserves') are selected by means of a secret ballot.

All CAMRA members are encouraged to be part of the GBG selection process by submitting Beer Scores every time they drink a cask ale or real cider in any pub or club.

Each month during 2022, the e-Newsletter will be focussing on one of the ten GBG entries. This month we feature *Orpington Liberal Club*, see [page 10](#).



Pub of the Year

We have just announced the Bromley CAMRA *Pub of the Year* for 2022. The Pub of the Year competition is one of the ways that CAMRA tries to support and promote quality pubs. The Bromley PotY will now be judged against the PotYs of the other 12 London Branches; judging will start in April. The winner of the London Region competition will then go forward to a 'super-regional' stage, and potentially then to the national final. The national winner will be announced In November.

How does Bromley Branch select the PotY?

- In **December** each year, branch members are invited to submit nominations and to volunteer to join the judging panel.
 - Any member of the branch may volunteer to be a judge.
 - There is no maximum number of judges.
 - Judges must visit of all the shortlisted pubs
- In **January** a shortlist of eligible pubs and clubs is drawn up from the list of nominations.
 - The judging period is approx. 3 weeks during late January / early February.
 - Judges score the pubs on the criteria used for the CAMRA National Pub of the Year award.



- The judges' decision is based on the total number of points awarded by the judges and on the ranking of the pubs by the individual judges.
- The award decisions are announced in late **February** or early **March**

Bromley uses the CAMRA **National Guidelines** for judging our pubs for the Pub of the Year. These guidelines ask judges to look at:

1. Quality and Condition of Product
2. Promotion and Knowledge of Product
3. Cleanliness and Staff Hygiene
4. Service, Welcome and Offering
5. Style, Décor and Furnishings
6. Community Focus & Atmosphere
7. Sympathy with CAMRA's Aims
8. Overall Impression and Value

Did you know...?

In 2015, Bromley won the Greater London Regional awards for **both** the Pub and Club of the Year?

Club of the Year

Licensing regulations mean that the bars at most clubs are normally open only to members of that club, and any guests have to be 'signed in' by a club member.

To be eligible for consideration for the Bromley CAMRA Club of the Year award, clubs must allow card-carrying CAMRA members to visit the Club. Currently only four clubs in Bromley allow access for CAMRA members, these are:

- Beckenham Rugby Football Club
- Orpington Liberal Club
- Royal British Legion Club, Hayes
- Royal British Legion Club, Petts Wood



As with the award for pubs, winners of CAMRA branch club awards are entered into the regional competitions, from which winners can progress through to the national award. Orpington Liberal Club has reached the national finals ('the final four') in 2014, 2016, and 2020.

Good Beer Guide 2022. Featured Venue of the Month

Bromley is allocated just ten entries in the Good Beer Guide, with the 2022 issue listing seven pubs, two micropubs, and one club. This month our BR6 Pub & Club Contact, Norman Warner, writes about the multi award-winning Orpington Liberal Club.



Orpington Liberal Club has been listed in the Good Beer Guide (GBG) every issue since 2014, and has been the Bromley Branch *Club of the Year* every year from 2013.

In addition, the club is a five-times winner of the Greater London Regional award, and has reached the 'final four' in the national award in four different years. It is therefore perhaps all the more remarkable that this flourishing club is managed and run entirely by volunteers.

So what is the Club's secret to success, and how have the volunteer team, led by Peter and Phil, achieved this? As you might expect, there are a number of contributing factors. Firstly the dedication and enthusiasm of the whole team is fundamental.

Next, how many bars can say that, throughout 2021, cask beer has been available continuously, either at the bar, served at tables, served in the garden, for take-out or home delivery, in sealed freshly poured 2-pint containers? The variations in service were necessitated by the Covid guidelines and restrictions.

During 2021, the ever-changing range of beer has encompassed **354** casks from **62** brewers. At any one time between three and six ales were available, depending upon the constraints of the pandemic.

More than half of these beers were 'LocAle', (where the brewer is no more than 30 miles away). LocAle encourages the local economy and reduces the environmental impact, i.e. less beer miles!

The Club's aim during the pandemic was to keep to 'business as usual' as far as was possible, and resumed running beer festivals and special events as soon as was practicable.

- CAMRA Greater London Regional Club of the Year, 2013, 2015, 2017, 2018, 2019
- CAMRA Bromley Club of the Year, 2013-2022
- CAMRA Good Beer Guide, 2014-2022



The Club ran a very successful Autumn Festival last October, with 21 casks, 2 kegs and 8 ciders on offer), a Winter Ales week was held in December and then a *Meet-The-Brewer* and *tap takeover* in February with Tonbridge Brewery (as was reported in the February e-Newsletter)

This month sees the Spring Real Ale and Cider Festival, from 24th - 27th March, and on 27th April they will hosting another MTB / tap takeover evening, this time with Twickenham Fine Ales.

All this, together with a packed schedule of live music events! What's not to like?

Clock House, Kent House, Penge and Sydenham,



Three of Bromley's breweries Southey, Three Hounds and BR3WERY, plus Ignition in Sydenham have jointly launched a 'Local Brewery Loop', a three mile walk the four breweries in the area.

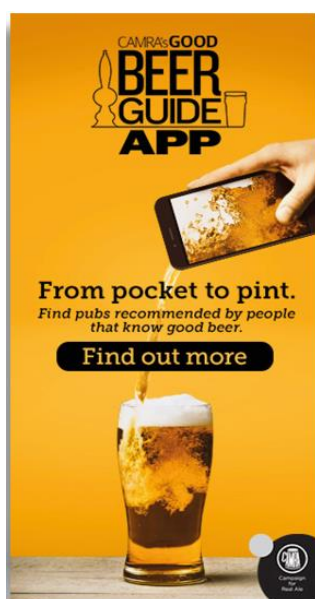
According to their [website](#):

"Each venue has maps to take away to guide you on your route.

"On the back of the map is a loyalty card which you can get stamped at the bar on purchase of your drink in each venue.

"Once you have collected all four stamps - show the staff at any venue to receive your 'I looped the loop' exclusive button badge!"

Not all the venues are open every day, and the website recommends the best times to do the loop, so as to catch all four of the taprooms/bars.



Good Beer Guide 2022 is now Sold Out!

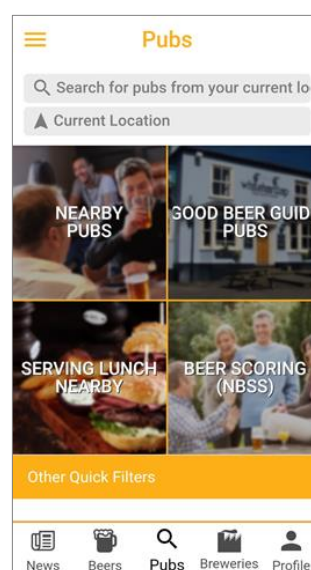
However, have you tried the **Good Beer Guide App**?

CAMRA News

The Branch Secretary runs through some of the national and regional news from CAMRA.

Good grief, did I really say that spring was on the way only last month? Having seen my local area twice make the BBC news the other night, thankfully with no major injuries (the 320 bus driver was incredibly lucky, as indeed was the driver of the Alliance van) plus an attempt at snow at the weekend, it seems that Mother Nature has more for us yet!

But MARCH has the Spring Equinox, a time to move on from the fireside to the pub garden, complete with parasols, upturned flower pots (thank heavens I no longer smoke) and staggering out of the pub with a tray of beer, crisps and soft drinks, only to trip on that last step....

Hoping we get a sudden warm dry spell, what has CAMRA been up to over the last month?

The taxing of alcohol

Well, on this, CAMRA and SIBA are urging the Treasury to amend tax plans to help small brewers and cask beer thrive. New research from the CAMRA shows that Chancellor Rishi Sunak's plans for a new way of taxing alcohol excludes many small brewers and cider producers.

The changes, announced in last year's Budget, offer a different rate of taxation for beer and cider served from draught in order to encourage people to drink in and support local pubs and other licensed venues. (AKA, Good News)

However, the tax break is only applicable for beer and cider served in containers of 40 litres and over, which excludes many of the country's finest small and independent brewers. It seems that 34% of licensees said they stock products in containers less than 40 litres to improve the quality and choice of beer and cider for consumers.

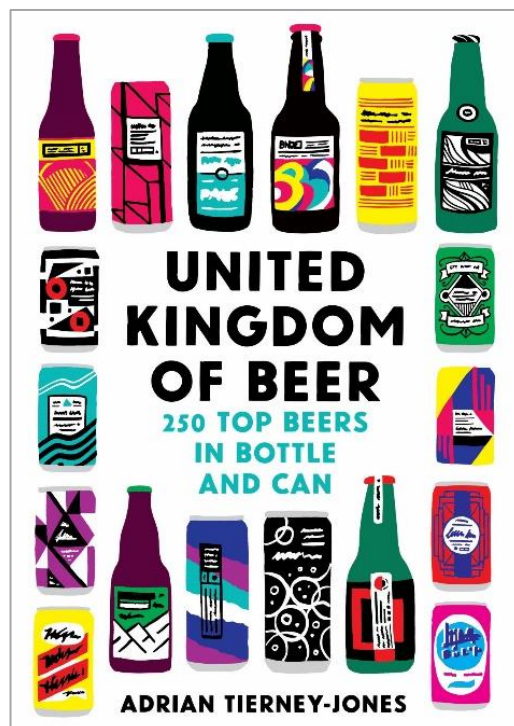

Bottle Beer and Cans – a new publication

Following on from my notes last month concerning Real Ale in a Bottle, I am delighted to be able to mention the new publication 'United Kingdom of Beer'. This is the only book on the market to focus on British and Northern Irish beers available in bottle and can. It is written by one of the UK's foremost beer writers, Adrian Tierney-Jones, and features a carefully curated selection of 250 of the best UK beers available.

The book offers a comprehensive overview of the numerous types and styles of beer available in modern Britain, complete with tasting notes and fascinating background stories about each beer. It also gives an insightful look into how to pair the beers with food, mood and occasion. (*Lager and a ruby murray eh?*)

With a wide selection covering nine different beer styles ranging from muscular Best Bitter to midnight-black Imperial Stout, it is the perfect guide to find a beer to cater for all occasions and moods, from an evening spent in front of the fire to a barbecue with friends.

Sports on your pub TV

There is more than football, cricket and horseracing to be enjoyed (if you wish) on your pub's TV. The Winter Olympics may have finished (and congratulations go to our National Curling Teams), but during February CAMRA was seen to be urging pub-goers to support their local pub/club by choosing to watch the Winter Olympics and the Six Nations games at their local – did you do that?

To help viewers find a local screening for the games, CAMRA has set up a special filter on the home page of the online pub directory [WhatPub](#), which allows people to search easily online for local pubs with sports TV, or by using CAMRA's [Good Beer Guide app](#).



COVID 19

I know, I know, you have had enough of this, but just to highlight that an All-Party Parliamentary Group on Pubs (the 'Pubs APPG') has launched its ground-breaking '*Raising the Bar*' report, which aims to quantify the effect of the pandemic on pubs and the people who run them and identify opportunities to create a thriving pub sector. Follow [this link](#) read the CAMRA press release.



The Inquiry received over 15,000 responses from publicans, consumers, industry groups and academics – with many reporting that the Government did not understand the pub trade as well as it could, and that the current legislative framework surrounding the pub trade is disjointed.

It outlines key recommendations to Government, including tax reforms, debt crisis management, refining of the Pubs Code legislation and more direct investment. The full report can be found at: <https://apppg.camra.org.uk/inquiry/>

And just so you know - The All-Party Parliamentary Group on Pubs is made up of MPs from all parties and groupings, and aims to promote and support pubs, landlords and the communities around them.
