Beer Festival News

Preparations continue for the 2023 Bromley Beer & Cider Festival.

Summer is here and with it the CAMRA summer beer festivals. Somewhere we all can enjoy a drink or two outdoors. It was nice to see so many new faces and catch up with old friends when visiting our neighbouring branches in May.

It's now less than 2 months to go before we open the doors to the Bromley CAMRA Beer Festival 2023, with lots to share.



The <u>Rusty Bucket</u> crew in Eltham are at the festival this year delighting us with their cheese toastie.

As the mercury rises and the temperatures climb with the predicted heatwave, hotter than last year, the food has taken a Mediterranean and Latin vibe, with Greek or Brazilian food on the menu.

Most importantly the beers and ciders are being ordered.

We've been in contact with breweries directly to get some special harder-to-find editions and one-offs for a festival like no other... probably.

This year we've also limited each brewery to 2 beers to give a more diverse range and spread our support – it has been extremely difficult to decide which ones won't make the cut. With 90 beers and ciders available tickets are flying out the door, so go grab one to save disappointment at our <u>TCKTY</u> ticketing system.

Our flyers and beer mats have been going down a storm across Bromley, I've had reports of them running out within a few days. If you manage to find some of the mats take a picture and tag us on Instagram we'd love to hear from you. You don't have to dress in the same colour like this guy at the three hounds!

Our <u>Instagram</u> is also going to gradually unveil the range of beer and breweries that will be turning up at the festival, if you want to know if a sublime grapefruit pale or a cracking stout will be on at the festival, logon and keep up to date.

CAMRA News this month

The Branch Secretary runs through some of the national news from CAMRA.

I type this up in the gloom of my living room whilst the Sun blazes down outside. Perhaps a quick visit to a pub is recommended? I do hope that the last of the May Bank Holidays went well for you all!

So, my review of CAMRA news over the last few weeks includes:

The Black Sheep Brewery

Sadly, this brewery has posted a notice of intention to appoint Administrators. I can find no more at present on the website although it was considering a sale of the business and assets.

As CAMRA observes, imminent hikes in fixed costs like business rates and alcohol duty mean brewers and cider makers across the UK will be facing the same 'perfect storm' as the Yorkshire brewery. Black Sheep ales appear regularly at CAMRA events and their cask range is a much-loved sight at bars across the nation's pubs. CAMRA hopes a solution can be found which secures Black Sheep's future.

...and more potential bad news

In 2017, CAMRA helped pubs in England gain landmark protection, giving communities the right to have their say through the planning process before a pub is converted or demolished.

Did you know that this protection is now at risk from a new scheme being proposed as part of the Government's levelling up plans? The High Street Rental Auction scheme aims to bring empty buildings – including pubs – back into use, by letting Councils auction off the lease.

These leases would allow pubs to be converted to other uses, divided up into multiple units, or gutted of their bars, cellars, or other integral features. Concerningly, there would be no obligation to reinstate the pubs fittings at the end of the lease – in fact developers would be able to apply to make the conversion permanent.

Our National Chair, Nik Antona has written to Dehenna Davison MP, asking that this proposal is reconsidered. For more on this and sight of the letter, please see: <u>CAMRA calls on Minister to save high street pubs - CAMRA - Campaign for Real Ale</u>

Because of this, CAMRA is now asking you, its members, to write to their local MPs letting them know that Government proposals cannot go ahead in their present format. For advice and suggestions on what you can do, see: High Street Rental Auctions - CAMRA - Campaign for Real Ale

...but the good news is:

That there has been a launch of a third round of the Government's Community Ownership Fund which is there to assist communities to save their local pub as a Community Asset.

Nik Antona comments, "Our locals are a vital part of both our social fabric and our local economies. They deserve to be protected as community assets which is why more and more local people up and down the country are taking over their local as a community-owned pub when it is faced with closure, demolition or conversion".

Nik goes on to say "I hope that as many communities as possible that are looking to save their local pub submit bids for funding. As Gillian Hough (CAMRA Campaign Director) put it, "This is the perfect time to enjoy products from local cider makers, plan a day trip to see blossom at a local orchard, or just head to your local for a drop of tasty cider or perry. I encourage



everyone to raise a glass this May and sample the best of what makers have to offer. Wassail!"

For more on true cider (not that fake apple flavoured gassy stuff), over 440 makers can now be found at <u>Real Cider and Perry Producers (camra.org.uk)</u>. CAMRA encourages you to find and support their local producers. And, I would add, if you are fed up with all the New World Pale Ales as I have to admit I am, a proper cider is a wonderful alternative!

Summer of Pub

The past few years have presented an enormous challenge for the pub and brewing industry, as venues have faced skyrocketing energy and business costs. The Summer of Pub campaign aims to support and promote pub and club-going throughout the summer and there's plenty to celebrate.

David Jesudason has written a book on "Desi Pubs", published on 18 May. The book is the first of its kind and details his travels across the length and breadth of the country. It features more than 60 "Desi" pubs in detail, run by British-Indian landlords who have stamped their unique identity on a beloved institution and changed our preconceptions of the publican.

Space precludes me from going into the history of Desi Pubs so have a look at: <u>Discover the joy of Desi Pubs - CAMRA - Campaign for Real Ale</u> which I see also covers the launch by the Meantime Brewing Company of "Desi Pale Ale".

Now despite my earlier comments on pale ales, I might give this a try – the tasting notes advise "a strong base of mango and guava fruit notes with a subtle coriander spice. Turmeric and bay leaves were added in the boil with Willamette hops to supply pleasantly peppery notes". Good grief, whatever next!

So, that's about it for this month. Hope June benefits pub gardens everywhere!

BR1:	The Star and Garter (photo Bob K, who was drinking the Siren): Shuppener Shuppener
BR2:	 BR2 rep. review of Chequers Bromley Common I enjoyed a pint of Abbot Ale in good condition. The Chequers is a Greene King pub. Part of it is a historic old weatherboard building which has been there for over 160 years - I have an 1862 map which shows the pub! There is a courtyard at the front for outdoor drinking. Inside is pleasant with a vaguely historic interior. IPA was also available and usually Old Speckled Hen on handpump. BR2 rep. review of Bricklayer's Arms Masons Hill I enjoyed a pint of Masterbrew and a pint of Spitfire both in excellent condition. This is a large traditional pub with 2 bar areas and an outside patio with a first floor seating area. The pub has very comfortable furniture and a relaxed atmosphere. It has been here a very long time outlasting 2 other nearby pubs The Palace Tavern and The Five Bells - both sadly closed.

- Rose and Crown Green Street Green was the perfect venue for a family lunch. Beers on offer were Bexley BOB and Gun Scaramanga. Food was excellent and the large garden, with play area, provided a pleasant afternoon drink in the sunshine.
- The Maxwell has been consistently providing Greene King beers in good condition over the first couple of months since its refurb. These included Speckled Hen and Coronation Pale. A guest appearance of St Austell Tribute made for a bit of variety. I've also had a Sunday roast there, which is something I had never tried previously.
- Black Horse at Locksbottom had four ales to choose from. My excellent pint of Dark Star Hophead was £4:35 reduced to £3.35, as Ember Inns now give £1 per pint off on Monday & Thursday.
